# The Mae Tietbohl Tree History First Generation

This chapter is a reproduction of the data about the first generation immigrant children of Joachim Tietböhl. It is taken from the TREE History of Auchmuty, Tietböhl, and Foelschaw Families, dated May 19, 1967, supplemented by an update March 7, 1979. It was compiled by Anna Amanda Auchmuty Mae Tietbohl Guinter. The information below comes from the the pages of her tree history concerning the immigrant Tietbohl's. The tree history forms the foundation for this family history. Without her pioneering work this effort could not have been done. It is referenced throughout this work.

#### TREE HISTORY OF TIETBOHL FAMILY

Joachim Tietböhl (great, great, great grandfather of Ruth Arlene Leidecker) born May 13, 1815 died 1901. Born in Demmin, a town of Prussia in Pomerania, at the mouth of the Trebel and Tollense 29 Miles from Straslund. Pop. 8,850. Married about 1842 or 3 to Wilhelmina Wischman born 1820 died 1872. Born to them seven children - Charles, Frederica, William, Lena, Fred, Amelia, and Augustus.

- 2. Frederica Tietböhl 1851- 1911 married Fred Piel Sept. 19, 1853 died Nov. 1938.

- 4. Lena (Coleen) Tietböhl Aug. 23, 1856 Nov. 9, 1935 married Fred Gierman died April 23, 1920.
- 5. Fred Tietböhl born June 1, 1860 married Kate Rorsler born Sept 6, 1859.
- 6. Amelia Tietböhl born May 21, 1862 married George Reinehart born 1855 died 1901. Married George Gahiel born 1862 died 1921.
- 7. Augustus William Tietböhl born Dec. 26, 1864. Married Sophia Marie Caroline Foelschaw born April 13, 1870 Died Nov. 8, 1934. Married December 20, 1885. Eight children.

The basic information above was compared with records in United States Federal Census data, Social Security Death Indexes, newspaper articles and other sources referenced in this family history. Additional information about each of the original seven children and their descendants were added as found in source documents. The final result is presented in a standard Genealogical Report format with supplemental information and a complete index of names.

# Origin of the name Tietböhl

The name Tietböhlen originated in Sweden in the 17th century when King Gustavus Adolphus came south from Sweden across the Baltic Sea to Pomerania. During the Thirty Year's War some of his soldiers were of this name. After the Swedish king fell in the battle of 1632, these "böhlens1\*" remained along the Baltic Sea from Lubeck on the west to Stettin on the river Oder to the east. Through the long years this long name was improved to Tietböhl.2

Pomerania, or Pommern as it was called in Germany, was a Prussian province in northern Germany bordering on the Baltic Sea. It was surrounded by Mecklenburg-Schwerin on the West, Brandenburg on the South, and West Prussia on the East. It had a land area of 11, 654 square miles, roughly the size of Delaware and Maryland combined. The Oder River divided the country into two parts, Hither Pomerania (Vorpommern), the area west of the Oder and Farther Pomerania (Hinterpommern), the area to the east. Stettin, a port city 40 miles inland on the Oder, was the capital of Pomerania. The province was further divided into about 30 administrative districts or counties (Kreise; Kr.).



The Tietböhl ancestors were mostly rural people, farmers cattleman, blacksmiths and the like. 2One exception was Dr. Knut Friedrich Tietböhl who was reported to be honored by the Prussian royal house in 1689 for his important work with the epidemic diseases of scurvey and pestillence. 3



Part of Pomerania was annexed to Prussia in 1720 by King Frederick William I father of Frederick the Great and then in 1815 all of Pomerania became part of Prussia when the old Swedish territory was annexed.<sup>4</sup> By the mid 1800's the agricultural lands were taken by princes, dukes and other nobility leaving the farmers in poverty and servitude. Failing farms forced rural populations into the cities where children were reared under unspeakable living conditions.<sup>5</sup> King William I was also building his army by forced conscription notably for the Franco Prussian War of 1870 -1871 and after.<sup>6</sup>

Word spread in Germany about peaceful living and good jobs to be had for the asking in America. Ship lines spread the word by holding meetings and distributing posters advertising transit out to a better life. Nothing was said about the harsh condition aboard immigrant ships where passengers were crowded like cattle below deck in steerage class. Cheap fares but a slow 2 week voyage awaited the immigrants. Deaths were not unusual during these voyages and were routinely recorded on the ship's passenger lists.

Today all that is left of Pommerania is a German province called Mecklenburg-Vorpommern in which the Kreis (County) of Demmin is located.

# ENGLISH TRANSLATION 3 March 1970 Dear Frederick: I talk to you as American's talk to each other in neighborly friendship. I have friends in Los Angeles, that's how I know. I'm not surprised to hear from someone who has the same surname as I. You probably belong to the youngest generation having your whole life in front of you and it is nice to know that you are still interested in past history. I am 72 years old on a weak branch of the family tree, ready to pass on. I am a widower standing alone looking at the world with a different point of view through my glasses. With the World War II I had nothing to do, a gift of God had me safe from being a soldier and thanks to my lovely departed wife. Now back to you and your viewpoint. wife. Now back to you and your viewpoint. There have been some cases where you were able to search and find out who your relations are. One day back in 1937 a man came with the same name from Pommern. The town of Demmin also belonged to his ancestors. His long list of relatives started out with Tiedtböhlen. This name through the generation of years has been made better to Tietböhl. The name originated in Sweden back in the 17th century. In those days Sweden was a powerful country and was in possession and occupied all of Pommern. In 1634 King Gustav Adolf came with these "bohlens" to our thirty years war to earn laurels. But it was a big dissappointment because of Wellensteins seize. Then was Sweden's power torn because of Wallensteins seige. Then was Sweden's power torn down to the ground. But there were many of those soldiers who wanted to live and stay over on Pommern, Mecklenberg and up the river Oder to Stettin which became their new home. This particular man who came to me was no relation but was a name sake. He brought to me a good accurate scale chart of my relatives who lived there. I know the town of Demmin on the Cummerower Sea very well. With a pair of binoculars I can see my own home town in Mecklenberg very well. The area of your great-grandfather is exceptionally nice but it is in the East Zone. More namesakes can be contacted in Stettin and Wismar in the East Zone. If you ever have a chance to visit over there I would recommend you take advantage of it. I would appreciate it if all I have told you is suitable for your use. Other than that if you ever get away to Hamburg don't hesitate to stop and see me. Your letter has made me very happy and I wish you far away not knowing me a very pleasant, long life. I am very willing to assist you in any matter. 
The German dialect spoken by Joachim Tietböhl's family in Pomerania was called Plattdeutsch, the low German of the northern glacial costal region. To show the difference between this dialect and the language used by Martin Luther, a few words from the Lord's Prayer are given below: First in English (E), then in German (G), and finally in Plattdeutsch (PD). Note the great reliance on using umlauts in the last example:

(E). Give us this day our daily bread.

- (G). Unser täglich Brot gib uns heute.
- (PD. Ose dääglich Brööd giff uns Hüt.

In this larger scale map, the distance from Demmin to Schmarsow (the place of son Charles and Frederica is a little south of east at about seven and a half miles (12 Km.) These places are all in the county or Kreis of Demmin.




Joachim Tietböhl, with Son August and Daughter Emilie (Amelia.)

Archival Immigration Information.

Departure Hamburg, Germany.

This is a photo copy of the original Direct Passenger Index from Hamburg, Germany. It is alphabetical and shows the name Joachim Tietböhl on line 1518 under the Ship Silesia with Capt. Albers as ships master. Voyage # 80 on 25 September 1881 (departure) is referenced. On Feb. 1966 Peter Kennemann of Dortmund, Germany translated the information immediately beneath the notation: Tietböhl: Joachim is with I daughter and 1 son.

When the Silesia left the Port of Hamburg the outgoing passenger list shows the family under lines 218 Joachim, 219 Emilie and 220 August. The name of their place of origin is obscure but appears to be \_ \_ hen\_ \_ dow or possi bly \_ \_ hen\_ \_ kow: Family tradition says it is in the Kreis (County) of Demmin. There is also a small town in Pomerania (Prussia) of the same name.

There is a record of Joachim's oldest son Charles (Johann Carl Friedrich) marrying Friederika Johanne Sohphia Huhr in the records of Schmarsow near the town of Demmin. They came to Williamsport, PA in 1884. This helps tie the family to the Demmin area as place of origin.


Arrival New York, Castle Gardens:

This ship docked at the Port of New York on October 10, 1881. The full passenger complement was 926, all in steerage. Steerage being basically equivalent to a floating cattle car with a single fare about \$10. The Tietböhls were all listed as "farmers from Prussia."

#### DISTRICT OF NEW YORK, PORT OF NEW YORK

I, A. Albers, Master of the German SS Silesia do solemnly, sincerely and truly swear that the following List or Manifest, subscribed by me, and now delivered by me to the Collector of the Customs of the Collection District of New York, is a full and perfect list of all the passengers taken on board of the said Silesia at Hamburg-Havre from which port said Silesia has now arrived; and that on said list is truly designated the age, the sex, and the occupation of each of said passengers, the part of the vessel occupied by each during the passage, the country to which each belongs, and also the country of which it is intended by each to become an inhabitant, and that said List or Manifest truly sets forth the number of said passengers who have died on said voyage, and the names and ages of those who died. So help me God. Sworn to this 10 Oct 1881 (signed) RHousnup? So help me God. Signed A. Albers. List or Manifest of all the Passengers taken on board the SS Silesia whereof A. Albers is Master from Hamburg-Havre burthen \_\_\_\_\_\_tons.

Columns represents, names, ages, sex, occupation and country to which each belongs. All 926 steerage passengers listed United States as their destination.



This is the source document for the arrival of Joachim Age 46 sic, Emilie (Amelia) age 19 and August Tietböhl age 16 in the Port of New York on October 10, 1881. Interestingly, when the family left Hamburg, Germany Emilie was listed on the ship's papers as female. However the New York documents show her as a male. It was well known in Germany by 1881 that immigrants who were old and sick rather than young and strong would be sent back to Germany on the next ship. Young girls were disguised as boys in an attempt to avoid molestation and ages were exaggerated as well. Note lines 219, 220 and 221 for Joachi m, Emilie (Amelia) and Aug. (August) Tietböhl. They were Farmers from Prussia.




S.S. Silesia:The steamship SILESIA --the first of two steamships of this name owned by the Hamburg-America Line--was built by Caird & Co, Greenock (ship #150), and launched on 14 April 1869 . 3,142 tons; straight bow, 1 funnel, 2 masts; iron construction, screw propulsion (single-expansion engines), service speed 12 knots; accommodation for 90 passengers in 1st class, 120 in 2nd class, and 520 in steerage; crew of 120. Captain: A. Albers. Voyages in 1881: 8 round trips Hamburg to New York, all steerage passengers. After numerous owners she was renamed MONTEVIDEO and on 2 December 1899, wrecked off L obos Island, on the River de la Plata in South America.

#### Castle Garden/Castle Clinton

After processing through Castle Garden/Castle Clinton, the three immigrants settled in Williamsport, PA. For many years there was a steady stream of German settlers into Pennsylvania. Settlements got started between the Susquehanna and Del aware Rivers around fast- growing Philadelphia. As time passed, the newcomers moved west and north. Pennsylvania was the "promised land" due to liberal terms for land purchase, religious tolerance, existing German settlements, a countryside that looked a lot like Germany and a favorable economy. Arrival in America caused dropping the umlaut from the letter ö and the name became Tietbohl.

..Before 1855, there was no immigrant processing center. The shipping company presented a passenger list to the Collector of Customs, and the immigrants made whatever Customs declaration was necessary and went on their way.

..From August 1, 1855 through April 18, 1890 they came through Castle Garden (also known as Castle Clinton). The State of New York opened the very first examining and processing center for immigrants on an island off the southwest tip of Manhattan (Castle Garden). Immigration remained purely an affair of State, not federal, government until 1882. The court decision affirming Congressional supremacy over immigration (under the commerce clause) came down in 1875. But Congress did not act until passing the Immigration Act of 1882, which authorized the Treasury Secretary to contract with the states for enforcement of that law.

#### Castle Garden In-Processing


"All being ready, the emigrants proceed in a body up the corridor into the interior of the building, their boxes and baggage being removed to the luggage warehouses, and here they range themselves in order on the seats. In front of them, and in the centre of the building, which is lit by a glass dome, stand a staff of some dozen gentlemen, all busily engaged in making arrangements for facilitating the movements and promoting the settlement of the newly-arrived emigrants. Each emigrant, man, woman and child, passes up in rotation to the Bureau, and gives to the registrar his or her name and destination, as a check upon the return of the Captain of the vessel, who gives the

name, place of birth, age and occupation. One of the leading officers connected with the Bureau of Information then mounts a rostrum, and addressing the assembled emigrants, tells them that such as are not otherwise provided for, or prepared to pay for their accommodation, can find shelter under the roof of that building; that advice and information of the best and most reliable kind can be had relative to tickets for railway and steamer to take them East, West, North or South; as to the best means of obtaining employment, for which a register is kept in the Intelligence Department of the Institution; also as to the best and most expeditious routes to take, with facilities for corresponding with friends, and of changing money at the Bureau of Exchange. "

This Minor's petition taken by August W. Tietbohl confirms several things about his immigration status. First it states that he came in to this country in the year 1881 as shown on the ship's passenger manifests and at least one US Census. Secondly it confirms that he was under the age of 18 on arrival. It is witnessed by his older brother William Tietbohl who immigrated earlier in 1873. August renounced the authority of William Emperor of Germany on December 8th, 1886, to become a citizen of this country.

A landmark business in Williamsport, Pennsylvania was the Day and Night Restaurant, 318 Market St. It was Established by Augustus Wilhelm Tietbohl known to all as A.W. The restaurant opened it's doors 29 March 1915 and closed 1 July 1968. Most of the son's of AW were involved in managing and operating the business at one time or another. The restaurant was known for its varied fair and pastries especially the home made cinammon rolls. It was a place where one could drop in for a cup of good coffee and a pastry or a complete meal.... Day and Night. A menu from the 1930's is included in this chapter as well as a scaled down recipie of the original cinammon rolls for which the Day and Night was famous.



# Notes for Joachim Tietbohl

The basic source for this report comes from the family notes and oral tradition handed down from Joachim's descendants and recorded by Anna Amanada Auchmut y Mae Tietbohl Guinter. This is in the form of a "Tree History of Auchmuty, Tietbohl, Foelschaw/Voelschow Families," dated May 19, 1967. This history received only limited distribution within the Tietbohl family and is of course unpublished. This source was relied on to establish the link between Joachim and his children. In this tree history, the names of Joachim's seven children were identified as well as the order of their birth. From then on available census reports, death indexes, newspaper articles and other sources noted in this report were used. In a number of cases the children's vital information was updated as a result of census data.

The use of federal census records from 1880 forward is hampered by the census taker's problems with spelling the name. Then those who indexed the census results also added to the problem with their own interpretation of the census taker's effort. Wide variations in spelling occured: Sietbohl, Trebohl, Tietbohl, Tietbohl, Tietbohl, Tietbolih often on the same page and within a family listing. It became necessary to use the soundex spelling and do extensive double checking to be sure that a different family was not mixing in with the Joachim's descendants. Joachim's descendants only appear in the United States Federal Census for 1880 - 1930. The 1890 Federal Census is not available as it was destroyed by fire. The 1930 Federal Census is the latest one released by the government.

The propensity for the early Tietbohl's to name their male children with the same names of Albert, Augustus, Charles, and Frederick tends to create confusion as well among the individual families.

The 1900 Census is used as a baseline for birth and immigration information on all of Joachim's children.

The 1900 census for PA, Lycoming Co, S. Williamsport, 2nd Ward, ED 74, Sheet 13 shows the only census reference to JOACHIM ever found. Here he is listed with his daughter Rickie (Frederica) and her husband Fred Piel. Joachim is identified with the mispelled name of Tiebhle, Joseph as father-in-law, born May 1815, age 85, widowed, immigrated 1881, reads and writes English but does not speak it, and 18 years in the USA. At that time he was living at 253 West Mountain Ave, So. Williamsport, Pa.

The Gazette & Bulletin of Williamsport, PA of 27 April 1901, p. 3, reported: "Joachim Tietbohl died Wednesday afternoon at the home of his daughter Mrs. Fred Piel, in South Williamsport. He was aged nearly 86 years. The funeral will be held this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Interment in Wildwood cemetery."

The same newspaper of 29 April 1901, p. 5, reported: "The funeral of the late Joachim Tietbohl occurred from the home of his daughter Mrs. Fred Piel, in South Williamsport, at 2:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon. Interment was made in Wildwood Cemetery."

Joachim's name appears one last time in the records of Wildwood Cemetery, Williamsport, Pennsylvania where his burial plot is identified as Lot 519, Section "A" west, with single stone marker.

#### Notes for JOACHIM TIETBOHL:

In addition to the notes in the Forward section of this report:

The propensity for the early Tietbohl's to name their male children with the same names of Albert, Augustus, Charles, and Frederick tends to create confusion as well among the individual families.

The 1900 Census is used as a baseline for birth and immigration information on all of Joachim's children.

The 1900 census for PA, Lycoming Co, S. Williamsport, 2nd Ward, ED 74, Sheet 13 shows the only census reference to JOACHIM ever found. Here he is listed with his daughter Rickie (Frederica) and her husband Fred Piel. Joachim is identified with the mispelled name of Tiebhle, Joseph as father-in-law, born May 1815, age 85, widowed, immigrated 1881, reads and writes English but does not speak it, and 18 years in the USA. At that time he was living at 253 West Mountain Ave, So. Williamsport, Pa.

The Gazette & Bulletin of Williamsport, PA of 27 April 1901, p. 3, reported: "Joachim Tietbohl died Wednesday aftrenoon at the home of his daughter Mrs. Fred Piel, in South Williamsport. He was aged nearly 86 years. The funeral will be held this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Interment in Wildwood cemetery."

The same newspaper of 29 April 1901, p. 5, reported: "The funeral of the late Joachim Tietbohl occurred from the home of his daughter Mrs. Fred Piel, in South Williamsport, at 2:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon. Interment was made in Wildwood Cemetery."

Joachim's name appears one last time in the records of Wildwood Cemetery where his burial plot is identified with single stone marker.

#### Notes for WILHELMINA WISCHMANN:

Little is known about Wilhelmina except that passed down in oral tradition. No proof of her birth or death information is available. There is an indication that she had more than seven children as August Tietbohl's obit said he was the youngest of a family of 11.

About Wilhelmina, family tradition states: "She was of the nobility and was reserved for a person of royal blood. In fact her father had promised her to an officer of high rank. When she married Joachim, she was disowned because he was a farmer of common blood."

Charles bought a farm in Washington Twp, Pennsylvania on land now owned by the Federal Government as part of the Allenwood Federal Correction Facility (Allenwood Prison camp). The place was near Alvira. One child died in Germany before immigration.

Information on Charles and Frederica's vital statistics from LDS ancestral files and the 1900 Census. Charles and family in 1900 are mis indexed as TIETBHOL. The 1900 census shows Charles, wife Ricky and children William and Augustus are living on the farm in Washington Twp. Son Charles F. immigrated with them but is not in this 1900 household. Daughter Wilhelmina is not in the household either.

Letter from Demmin dated 25 January 1960 from Frank Maerz who performed research in the Demmin area gives additional information. No record was found in the Demmin Church records of the Tietbohl family. In the rural district of Schmarsow near Demmin:

In the marriage record of that church we found that Johann Carl Friedrich Tietbohl, farm laborer, age 28 and Friederika Sophia Huhr, age 23 were married on 30 September 1873.

In the Baptismal register we found the names of their children:

Caroline Friederike Wilhelmina Tietbohl born 18 June 1874 and Carl Friedrich Theodor Tietbohl born 23 February 1876. At that time the parents were living in Borgwall near Demmin.

From church member Richard Tietbohl living in Utzedel near Demmin we learned that his great uncle is supposed to have migrated to America. Richard's grandfather was Carl Friedrich Tietbohl, born 18 December 1825. The parents of Carl were Johann Michael Tietbeul and Marie Hagar.

It is possible but not proven that Carl Friedrich and Joachim were brothers and that the prior generation was Johann Michael Tietbeul and Marie Hagar.

Unfortunately all church records before 1846 were destroyed by the war events and no further information is available.

#### Notes for Frederica Sophie Huhr:

In the 1900 census "Ricky" for Fredericka is indicated as 50 years old and having immigrated with her husband and son William in 1884.

Mr. Tietbohl one of the proprietors of the Day and Night Restaurant, suffered a heart attack a little over a year ago and his death was due to complications. Until he suffered the attack, he had been in good health and active.

Born in Demmin, Germany, Dec. 26,1864, the youngest of a family of 11, he came to this country in 1880 (sic), settling in Williamsport and residing here ever since. His marriage to Sophia Voelschow, of this city, took place Dec. 20, 1885. She preceded her husband in death seven years ago.
